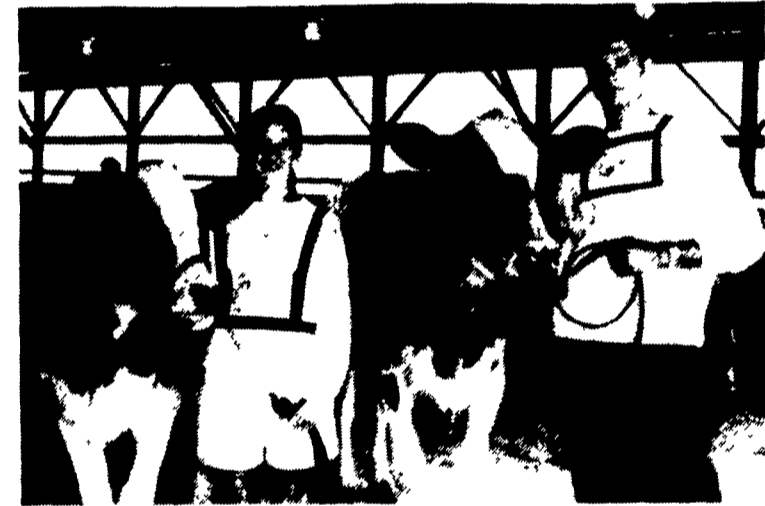

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — AU Tildys Khan Taffi-ET, a Jersey yearling daughter of Greenwood Sooner Khan, topped the 1997 National Heifer Sale in Indianapolis, bringing \$9,000.

The 1997 National Heifer Sale averaged \$2,629.59 on 49 head. The sale was held June 29 in Indianapolis in conjunction with the annual meetings of the American Jersey Cattle Association and National All-Jersey, Inc.

The top seller was consigned by Kurt and Carol Alberti, Wendell, Idaho, and will make her new home with Coppini Lane Jerseys, Ferndale, Calif.
