


Reserve champion market hog was exhibited by Kasey McAllister, right, who sold the hog for \$3.75 per pound to Bill Fairbairn.

Kasey, 17, is the daughter of Bill and Karen McAllister, Spring City. Kasey, who served as vice president of her FFA, is a graduate of Owen J. Roberts High School. She attends Wilson College, Chambersburg, and is studying to

be a veterinary technician.

The York crossbred was purchased by her father at the combined Parlett/Holloway Sale. Kasey said she walks the hogs twice a day for about a half mile overall. She had reserve champion about 5-6 years ago at the roundup, she said. She plans to show hogs at the state Farm Show.

Chet Hughes, Lancaster livestock agent, judged the show. There were a total of 98 hogs at the sale. The swine sale raised \$27,589.05. Average price with champions was \$1.20 per pound; without, \$1.14 per pound.

Lamb Show, Sale

Chet Hughes picked the 113-pound Suffolk/Hampshire crossbred lamb shown by Chris Swartzentruber, 13, Glen Moore, as the champion lamb.

Chris, son of John and Janet Swartzentruber, is in the 8th grade at Twin Valley Bible Academy. The lamb, bought at a Fleeners Auction in April, was sold to Bill Fairbairn for \$4.75 per pound for a total of \$536.75.

The reserve champion was shown by Inez Stoltzfus, 18, daughter of Carl and Hilda Stoltzfus, Elverson. Inez, a graduate of Conestoga Christian School, sold the 122-pound Stella, bought from Ken Smoker at New Holland Sales Stables, at the auction to Bill Mac-Cauley, Atglen, for \$4 per pound for a total of \$488.

There were a total of 36 lambs at the sale. The sale brought in a total of \$9,630.60. Average price with champions was \$2.40 per pound; without, \$2.25 per pound.

Auctioneer was Bill MacCauley, Atglen. There were about 100 registered bidders at the start of the sale. There were more than 250 bidders, friends, and family in the center during the sale.
