Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 2, 1997 were 4% more than last week, and 5% more than the same week last year.

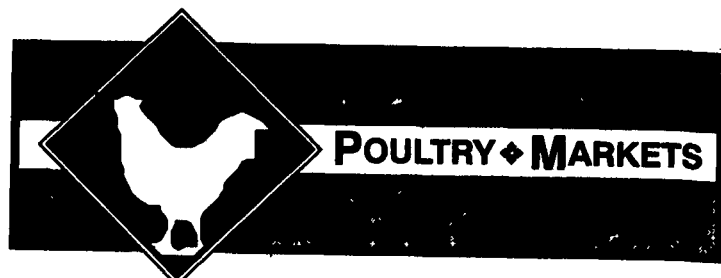
