## Farmer Receives Service Award

NEWARK, Del. — George J. Collins of Laurel, Del., has received the 1997 outstanding Service to Agriculture Award for Sussex County.

The award was presented Aug. 12 at the Sussex County Service Clubs' annual picnic at the University of Delaware Research and Education Center in Georgetown.

Born and raised in Laurel, Del., Collins was graduated from Laurel High School in 1949. For 40 years he and his wife, Marlene, worked the Laurel farm and raised two children, a daughter, Karen, and a son, Mark, who joined his father on the family farm in 1980.

Collins started as a soybean and corn grower, but later branched out into watermelon production and a broiler growout operation. He was at the vanguard of the trend toward irrigation in Sussex County, eventually installing irri-

gation systems over his entire farm of 1,000 acres.

Always a proponent of conservation practices, Collins used no-till techniques to reduce soil erosion and routine soil testing to determine accurate lime and fertilizer needs. He was among the first farmers on Delmarva to build a dead-bird composter and a manure storage building. In addition, his farm is enrolled in Delaware's tax ditch program.

Collins retired in 1991, leaving the farm operation to his son. That same year, father and son won the 1991 Master Farmer Award presented by Pennsylvania Farmer Magazine and Cooperative Extension Service for high achievement in farming and public service. He has also received the Delaware Farm of Distinction Award.

A Sussex County Councilman

from the 5th District serving his second term, Collins is also a member and past president of the Mar-Del Watermelon Growers Association, past director and president of the Southern Delaware Truck Growers Association, and past director of the Laurel Grain Company. He is a member of the Henlopen #20 Grange, the farm bureau, and chair of the Sus-

sex County Agricultural Lands Preservation advisory board.

Collins' service to agriculture through the University of Delaware's College of Agricultural Sciences has been exceptional. He is a member and past president of the Sussex County Extension Advisory Council and has served on the UD's Delaware Agriculture Research and Teaching Com-

mittee. A UD Extension cooperator for four decades, Collins has invited extension researchers to conduct demonstration projects on his farm, including testing for spider mite control, pregermination of watermelon seeds, in-row tilling practices, variety trials, nutrient tests, soil additives, and integrated pest management (IPM) of watermelons.


