

# Entries Total 140 Head At Tioga Junior Dairy Show

— Two sets of sisters shared four Jersey champion positions at the 1997 Tioga County Junior Dairy Show held here Aug. 6.

Christie Wilcox showed the grand champion Jersey, Duncan's Dollar Nina Noel, the first place aged cow. She was flanked by Cathleen Norman's senior 3-year-old, Normandell Jedd Payge, who was named the reserve grand champion of the show.

Among the junior animals, Samantha Wilcox walked into the top spot with her summer yearling, Eastmont Aaron Demi. In the reserve junior champion position was Ellen Norman with her summer yearling, Normandell Barber Jena.

The show, which boasted a total of 140 entries, was judged by Alan Chittenden of Shodack Landing, N.Y. and Paul Miller of Harrisburg, Pa.

In the Holstein show, Cha-Do Stardust Twinkle-TW paraded her way to the grand champion spot. The senior 2-year-old champion is owned by Trisha McIlwain. Named reserve grand champion of the show was Olivia Courtney's EsBern Vanguard Dell Dede, an aged cow.

Trisha McIlwain also took junior champion honors with her spring yearling, Cha-Do Charles Star dt T-Vanna. A summer yearling, Spring Mountain Jed Jiffy, owned by Courtney Worthington was named the reserve junior champion of the day.

Bradley Wales filled three of the four champion positions in the Ayrshire show including the grand and reserve grand champion and the reserve junior champion slots. Named grand champion was Blue Devils Star Buttercup, an aged cow and named reserve grand champion was his 4-year-old, Blue-Devils Daisy 35K.

The junior champion and reserve junior champion Ayrshires

were both from the junior calf class. Stefanie Long took the junior champion honors with Shale Hill Soldier Ruby and Bradley Wales showed the reserve junior champion, Blue Devils Jewel Royal.

In the Brown Swiss show, Mark Inman topped the other exhibitors with his dry cow, Rocky Slope RL Blend Tulsa. In the reserve grand champion position was Jason Butler with his dry cow, Bo Ka Blend Maria.

Named junior champion Brown Swiss was Mark Inman's summer yearling, Rocky Slope RL PR Jade. The reserve junior champion Brown Swiss was Rocky Slope RL Ele Faith, owned by Lisa Fitch.

David Kriner showed both the grand and reserve grand champion Guernseys at the show. Castle's Dairy Patsy, a junior 3-year-old, topped the show, while Castles King Flash Gloria, a dry cow, stood in the reserve champion position.

The junior champion of the Guernsey show was Leroydale Stars Reba, owned by Jordy McIlwain.

In a small Milking Shorthorn show, Michael Pierce showed the grand champion with his 4-year-old, Honey. The reserve grand champion was Kuszmar Nancy Soo, owned by Bradley Wales.
