Milk Cooperative Returns 70% Dividends In Cash To Members

RESTON, Va. -- Maryland and Virginia Milk Producers Cooperative Association, Inc. will be distributing \$4,530,077 to its members today, or 24 cents per hundredweight for milk shipped during 1996. This distrubtion represents both divisional earnings from internal operations and special allocations received from other cooperatives. Based on the cooperative's 1996 divisional earnings, Maryland and Virginia will return 70 percent of each members cooperative investment in cash. Special allocations are determined by the cooperative from which they are received. The total cash distribution is 15.6 cents per hundredweight, which includes both divisional earnings and special allocations.

Normally mailed on September 1, the dividend check will be mailed ten days early this year, on Friday, August 22, in an effort to case the financial struggles of dairy farmers. The remaining 30 percent, or 8.5 cents per hundredweight in 1996, has been issued in certificates held in the cooperative's revolving fund.

Third Straight Year

Maryland and Virginia has distributed 70 percent of the patronage dividend in cash to members for three consecutive years, and averaged 56 percent over the last

According to President Jack Hardesty, a dairy farmer from Berryville, Virginia, "Because of the cooperative's excellent financial condition, the board of directors for Maryland and Virginia has been committed to returning as much cash as soon as possible to the cooperative members."

45.6 Cents/CWT Total

The 15.6 cent/cwt patronage dividends are in addition to 30 cents per hundredweight that producers received in a 13th check in February and last fall. Distributed to producers for the last 19 years, the 13th check normally is mailed in its entirety in February. However, approximately six cents per hundredweight were distributed monthly in the fall of 1996 to compensate for high feed prices dairy farmers were experiencing. In February, Maryland and Virginia producers received the addi-

tional 24 cents per hundredweight. Only 20 Percent By Law

By law, cooperatives are required to return only 20 percent to its members. However, with

this year's low milk prices and drought conditions, couple with Maryland and Virginia's strong financial position, the cooperative felt it was necessary to return as much cash as soon as possible to the cooperative members.

General Manager George Walgrove added, "We understand dairy farmers are struggling now with low milk prices and drought conditions, and hope that this patronage dividend check will help to ease the financial challenges of today's dairy industry."

Maryland and Virginia Milk Producers Cooperative Association, headquartered in Reston, Va., is a milk marketing and pro cessing cooperative which markets milk for 1150 dairy farmers throughout Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia and Delaware. The cooperative includes Marva Maid, a milk processing division in Newport News, Va.; a manufacturing division in Laurel, Md.; and an equipment division in Frederick, Md.
