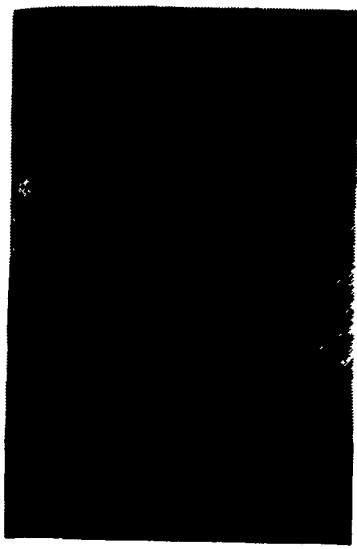

Keeping Up With Environmental Laws Critical To Ag Producers

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Most agricultural producers have a general understanding of state and national environmental laws and how they affect their individual operations, but now more than ever, producers need to know the complete details of those regulations for their own protection according to presenters at the Resource Management Planning Conference.

John Copeland, director of the National Center for Agricultural Law and Research Information (NCALRI) at the University of Arkansas School of Law in Fayetteville, said there is no substitute for environmental compliance.

"There are more laws than ever that apply to agriculture," said Copeland. "Farmers have to be concerned because they can be targeted as a defendant — both civil and criminal. We not only

see lawsuits being filed against farmers and ranchers by a third party claiming bodily injury and property damage, but ag producers also need to better understand how government environmental regulations might affect them. Our job is to try to keep farmers out of trouble so we try and educate them to avoid the sort of pitfalls that can cost them their livelihood."

He also consults with dairy herd operators, agribusinesses and pharmaceutical companies.

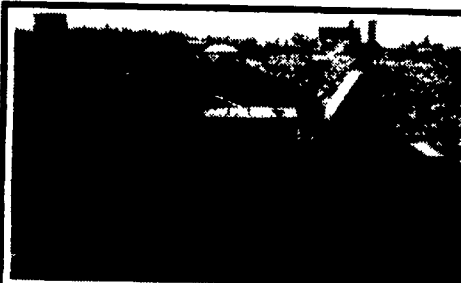

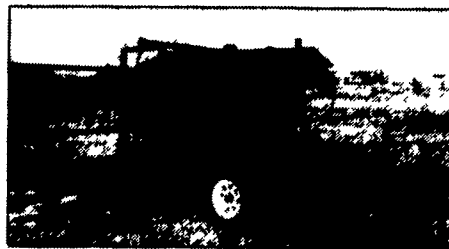
