In some cultures, eclipses of either the Sun or the Moon were believed to portend evil omens and considered unsuitable times for beginning new projects, sowing seeds, or making major decisions. Some people thought the Sun and Moon were at war with each other and that the obscured vision of either meant a battle was in progress. In China, a dragon was credited with devouring the heavenly body. Native Americans might shoot burning arrows at an eclipsed Sun, hoping to relight the flame.

It is not necessary to light a candle to the Sun.


