Compared to last Monday: Holiday
shortened receipts provided little in way of
market test. Feeder cattle and calves steady
to 2.00 lower but not well tested. Quality of
light supply mostly plain, few average.
Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 higher.
Slaughter bulls 1.00 higher. Packer
demand good for light receipts. Total of
225 head cows and bulls sold with 65 per-
cent going to packers. Receipts this week
1,400; last week 8,768; last year 2,608.
Supply consisted of 51 percent yearlings
over 600 lbs; 33 percent calves under 600
lbs; 16 percent cows and bulls. Prices fol-
low with weighted average weight and
price in parenthesis.
