

Gor Wood D Holsteins Claims Supreme Champion Title

WHITNEYVILLE (Tioga County) — Representatives from each breed circled slowly around the ring as judge Gary Rogers examined each one carefully before naming the supreme champion of the Tioga County Open Dairy Show.

The competition immediately followed the open Holstein show held Saturday, Aug. 9.

"I look at their individual characteristics," said Rogers. "When it comes down to making hard decisions, and I'm there right now, I'm basing my decision on the most important component of the cow, the udder."

After commenting on the quality of all the animals, he turned to Chenango Lincoln Santa, the 4-year-old grand champion Holstein owned by Gor Wood D Holsteins of Mansfield, and named her the supreme champion of the show.

Also in contention for the supreme champion title was the Jersey grand champion, Normandell Jedd Payge, owned by Cathleen Norman of Liberty; the Ayrshire grand champion, Blue Devils Star Buttercup, owned by Bradley Wales of Millerton; the Brown

Swiss grand champion, Rocky Slope RL Mag Justine, owned by Mark Inman of Roaring Branch; the Guernsey grand champion, 'King Flash Gloria, owned by David Kriner of Mansfield; and the Milking Shorthorn grand champion, Honey, owned by Mike Pierce of Wellsboro.

The reserve senior and reserve grand champion Holstein was C Terbeck Broker Delore, also owned by Gor Wood D Holsteins.

Among the junior animals, L&J Delaware Holly, owned by Leroy and Ida Jane Plance, was named the junior champion while EsBern Delaware Geneva Gene, owned by Hal Courtney, was named the reserve junior champion of the show.

Capturing premier breeder and premier exhibitor honors was Es Bern Dairy Farms of Mansfield.

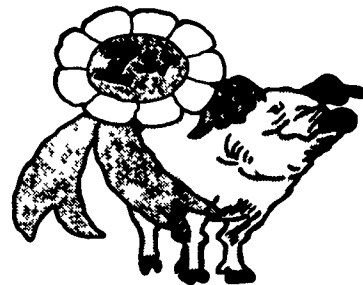
