Antique Tractor Show

GILBERT (Monroe Co.) — The Pocono Old-Tyme Farm Equipment Association presents the 2nd Annual Antique Tractor, Gas Engine and Farm Equipment Show here at the West End Fairgrounds on Friday, Sept. 19 - Sunday, Sept. 21.

The show hours are 9 a.m. until dusk Friday, Saturday and Sunday. There is an admission charge of \$1 per person and 12 years old and under are free accompanied by an adult.

Scheduled entertainment includes Friday 3 p.m. to 8 p.m., 107 FM Country Radio live broadcast; Saturday from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. "The Hawks," and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., "Jerry & The Night Riders Band," and Sunday at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., "The Mark Twain of the Pennsylvania Dutch" (Gary Gates, comedian).

Scheduled events on Friday include "Kid's Hay Maze Race (kid's tractors race through bales of hay set up in a maze); tractor parade; and at 7 p.m., a cake walk.

On Saturday there will be an 11 a.m. tractor parade. At noon there is a Kid's Pedal Tractor Pull (weight class is 35 pounds to 100 pounds with the tractors provided by the Pocono Old-Tyme Farm Equipment Association); 1 p.m. Kid's Pedal Tractor Race; 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., wheat threshing

machine demonstration; 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., antique farm tractor pull; 4 p.m., antique engine slow competition awards; and a watermelon eating competition sometime in between other scheduled activities. During the day, those that compete in the antique engine slow competition will be monitored to see whose antique engine runs the slowest, which will determine the winner.

To compete in the Antique Farm Tractor Pull on Saturday at 2 p.m., you must register on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and must be 16 years or older and you may use your own antique tractor that was built up until 1960 (note that modified tractors are not allowed). A \$10 registration fee is required. Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place winners, plus cash for the 1st and second place winners only.

Scheduled activities on Sunday include 10 a.m. church services for all faiths; from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., wheat threshing demonstrations; noon, tractor parade; 1 p.m., tractor driving skill competition; and at 2 p.m., kid's pedal tractor pull.

The event will also feature a Craft Show and Flea Market all three days. Vendor spaces are \$10 for a 10 foot frontage. To register or for more information, call (610) 681-5419 or (717) 992-7328.

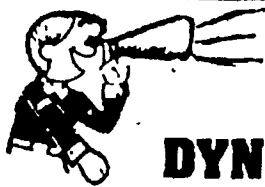
