 Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was limited. Offerings of 3 pound and heavier weights were readily available and difficult to clear. 2.5 pound sizes were in short supply. Live supplies remained at least moderate; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, wings were short of full needs. Other items were at least adequate for a generally lackluster buying interest, particularly breast cuts which were burdensome.

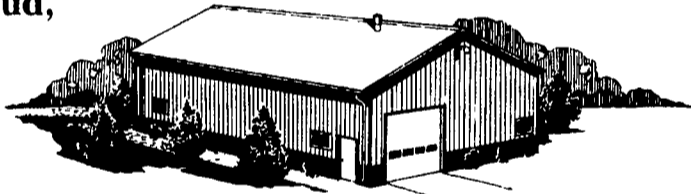

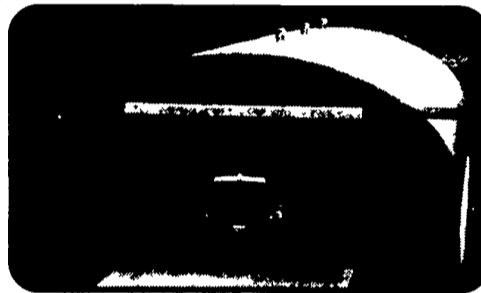

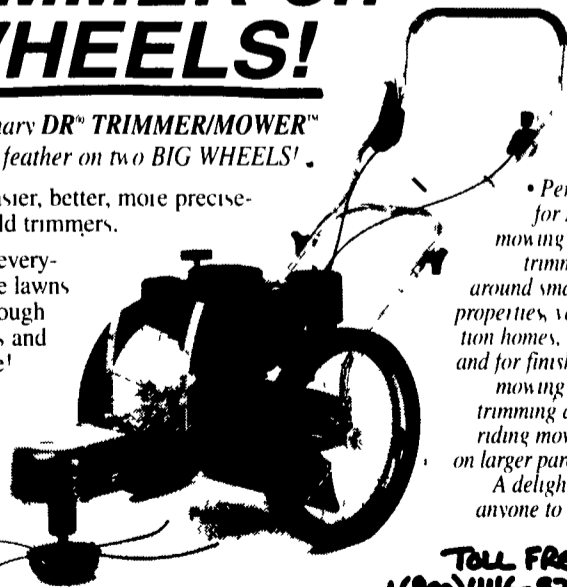
