Bloomsburg Fair Boasts Increase In Exhibitors

Union Co. Correspondent BLOOMSBURG (Columbia Co.) — Agricultural exhibits at the 143rd Bloomsburg Fair held recently increased by four percent over last year in spite of avian flu, summer drought, and adverse economic conditions for farmers.

New features at this year's fair included having 4-H clubs "leasing" animals to urban kids for livestock shows, Spam and Pillsbury recipe contests, and a dressup livestock fun night.

The Bloomsburg Fair also has a website, which is the largest of its kind on the Internet. "Martha the Cow" fields questions about the fair on c-mail, a trivia contest is conducted (which a Taiwanese girl won), and a guest book provides a forum for opinions about the fair. At the Eastern Central District Holstein Show on Sept. 24, Judge Norman Hill of Woodbine, Md., chose Pen-Col Leadman Dewdrop as grand champion as well as best udder of show. Nicholas Wolff of Millville exhibited this first place 5-year-old. The reserve champion was C Watavue Flora Broker, a

4-year-old shown by John Rishel of Mifflinburg. There were 61 exhibitors in the competition.

Junior champion honors went to Robert Bronson's Rob-Run Charles Betsy, the first place senior ycarling heifer, while reserve junior champion was Wynding-Brook Dstar Larane, shown by Cliffor Levan of Milton. Bronson is a veteran showman at the fair, from Bloomsburg.






