

## Quarter Horse Wins Challenge of the Breeds

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — A quarter horse, "Call Lou Cinda Steel," was named the Keystone Sovereign Champion in the 1997 Challenge of the Breeds held last week as part of the 41st annual Keystone International Livestock Exposition at the Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg.

Owned by Crystal Zeller of Bernville, the quarter horse was ridden by Angie Zeller, who was third in last year's contest. The winner received \$1,000.

Reserve champion was an Appalossa, "Andrew's Empress," owned and ridden Tammy Styer of Greenlane, who received \$500.

The contest, spponsored in part by the Fieldstone Meadows Horse Farm and Glatfelter Insurance Group, featured 14 horses in nine breeds and competing in six events, including pleasure driving, English pleasure, hunter hack, western pleasure, western riding and barrel racing.

"IshKaBibble," a half-Arabian owned and ridden by Megan Deveney, Enola.


"Positively Pale," a Paint owned by Tamara and Dawn Erdock and ridden by Tamara Charters.
