

# Watershed Awareness Campaign

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — The Lancaster County Conservation District has begun a watershed awareness campaign, "Let's Make One Thing Perfectly Clear."

The campaign is funded with a \$3,000 grant from the Pennsylvania League of Women Voters. The grant program includes billboards with the slogan in five different locations throughout the county, a dynamic poster with information on watershed and what a person can do to protect them, a map of all the watersheds in the county, three educational sessions for the public, and a mailing of watershed education information.

The goal is to inform and educate the residents of Lancaster County on watersheds and their importance, and for each person to know about the watershed in which they live. The end result is the formation of a citizens watershed association in each watershed.

The educational series is scheduled for October and November and will be cosponsored with the Lancaster County Water Resources Task Force and Land Studies, Inc., Lititz and State College. Co-sponsors for the series include the Lancaster County Planning Commission, Penn State Extension Service, Chesapeake Bay Foundation, and the Natural Resource Conservation Service. The programs are as follows:

- October 27, You're a Part of the Solution to a Healthy Watershed — Find Out How? - 7 - 9 p.m. Farm & Home Center, Lancaster.

The first meeting lays the ground work for the series. We answer the question "What is a Watershed," how many are there in the county and what is distinctive about each one?

- November 10, Watershed Associations: Where It All Happens! - 7 - 9 p.m. Farm & Home Center, Lancaster.

The second meeting will give the nuts and bolts on how to start a watershed organization. Speakers will include representatives from the Octoraro Watershed Association and related grassroots groups.

- November 17, Let's Get Started: Making Our Watersheds Perfectly Clear - 7 - 9 p.m. Farm & Home Center, Lancaster.

This meeting is a work session for those communities serious about starting a watershed organization. Facilitators will work with specific work groups from individual watersheds and municipalities.

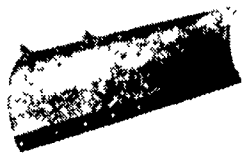

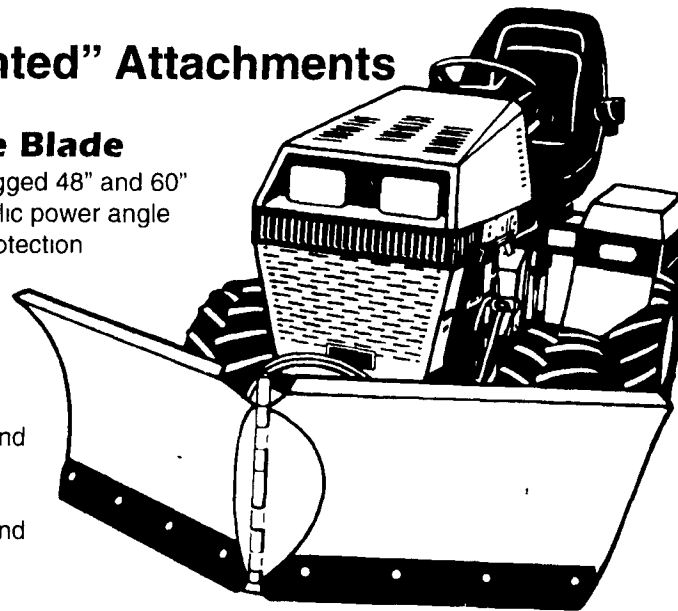
