Apple Brown Betty 3 cups tart apples, diced 1½ cup soft bread crumbs

3 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup butter, melted 1/4 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon cinnamon

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1/3 cup water

Add melted butter to bread crumbs. Combine apples, sugar, salt, and cinnamon. Place a layer of buttered bread crumbs in bottom of greased casserole. Add a layer of diced apples, and another of crumbs. Continue with alternate layers, having crumbs on top. Combine lemon juice and water and pour over mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour.

Lemon Sauce

½ cup sugar

11/2 tablespoon cornstarch

11/2 cups boiling water

1/4 teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons butter

Grated rind and juice of 1 lemon

Mix sugar, salt, cornstarch. Add boiling water. Stir until smooth. Cook until clear. Remove from heat. Add rind, juice, and butter. Stir well.

Lemon Sauce

¼ cup butter

% cup sugar or 1 cup confectioners' sugar

1 teaspoon boiling water

1/4 teaspoon salt

% teaspoon lemon extract

Cream butter and sugar. Add remaining ingredients. Beat. Chill before serving on fruit desserts.

Chocolate Zuchinni Brownies

½ cup butter

2 eggs

1% cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

4 tablespoons cocoa

1 teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

2½ cups flour

½ cup buttermilk

2 cups zuchinni, shreded

½ cup chocolate chips

½-1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Add dry ingredients alternately with buttermilk. Fold in zucchini, chocolate chips, and nuts. Bake in greased 9x13-inch pan at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

Zucchini Bars

3 eggs

2 cups sugar

2 cups grated zucchini

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

% cup raisins

1 cup nuts

1 cup chocolate chips

2 teaspoons vanilla

1 cup oil

3 cups flour

1 cup cocoa

1 teaspoon salt 1 cup crushed pineapple, drained

3 teaspoons cinnamon

Mix together eggs, sugar, vanilla, and oil. Add flour, cocoa. baking powder, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon. Fold in raisins, nuts, zucchini, chocolate chips, and pineapple. Bake in 15x10-inch pan at 350 degrees about 60 minutes. Frost with cream cheese using if desired.
