

# Susquehanna Livestock Sale Posts Results

**HARFORD (Susquehanna Co.)** — Recently at the Harford Fairgrounds, local 4-H'ers successfully offered 82 market animals for sale at the Susquehanna County 4-H Livestock Sale.

Area businesses, banks, parents, and friends purchased 14 market steers, 14 market lambs,

and 54 market hogs at the sale.

The sale's 1997 high volume buyer was Wyalusing Livestock by purchasing three steers, one lamb and five hogs.

The grand champion homebred steer at 1,065 pounds was exhibited by Neil Wells and purchased by Bingham's Restaurant for \$1/pound. The reserve champion homebred steer at 1,005 pounds was exhibited by Dana Wells and purchased by B.S. Quarries for \$1.65/pound.

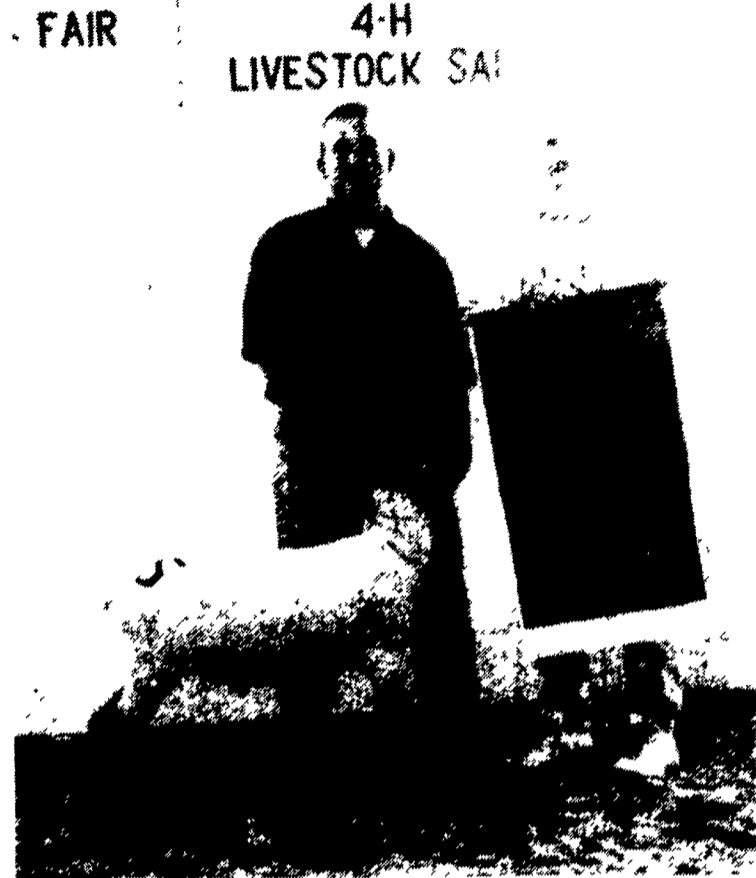

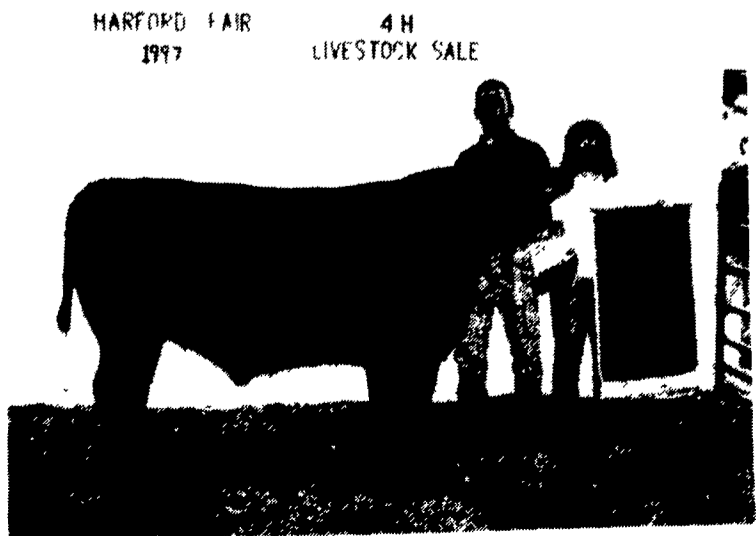

Grand champion homebred lamb buyer CoreStates Bank and exhibitor David Harvatine.



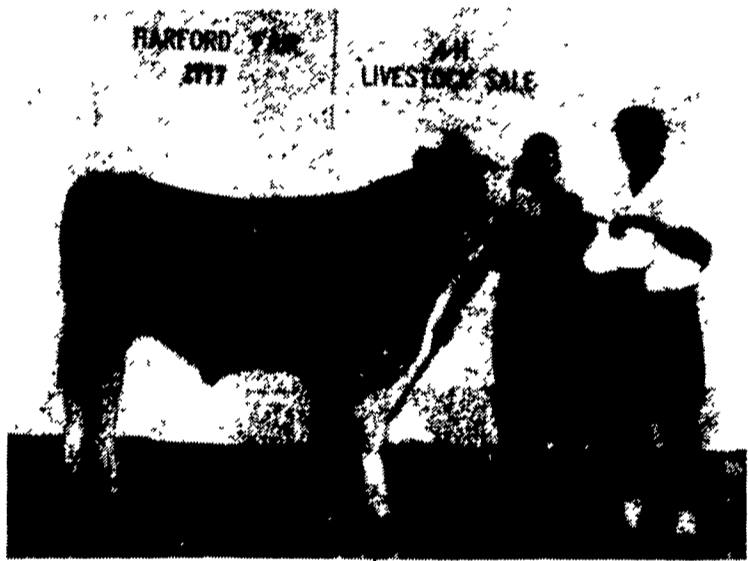
