Directory to List Forage Producers

ALLENTOWN (Lehigh Co.) — The continued dry conditions this growing season could leave area dairy and livestock producers with short feed supplies.

In an effort to provide forage producer contacts to anyone interested in purchasing hay, straw or silage, Lehigh County Cooperative Extension is producing an updated Southeastern Pennsylvania Forage Directory for distribution this fall. The directory will list forage producers with supplies for sale from the entire eight-county region.

The revised directory has two functions. In addition to allowing the forage consumer easy access to available regional supplies, the increased marketing opportunities for the forage producer is well documented. Total acres

harvested for hay make it the number one field crop in the commonwealth. This ranking is due to Pennsylvania's ideal forage growing conditions and the vital need for this feedstuff by the states livestock. The 170,000 head of cattle, 27,000 horses and 11,000 sheep in the southeastern region of Pennsylvania rely on forage as a major part of their diet.

In preparation for the release of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Forage Directory, Lehigh County Cooperative Extension is updating its mailing list. Any forage producers interested in being placed in the directory and any forage consumers interested in receiving the directory should contact their local Penn State Cooperative Extension office.

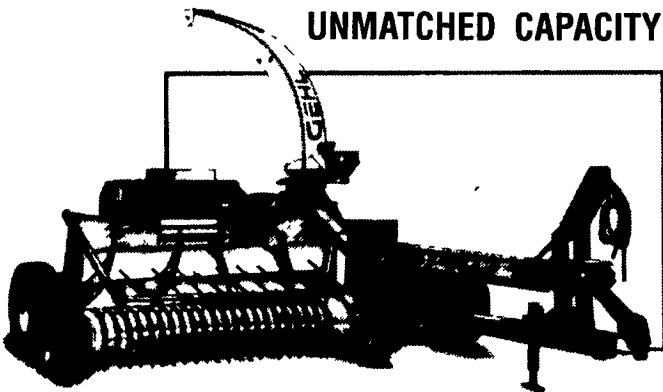
