The treasurer's report showed a beginning balance of \$34,768 with additional income of \$25,501 during the past year. A golf tournament was held for a fund raiser and parti-

cipation in two Gourmet Fests at Donecker's Market served as promotional events.

A donation of \$1,000 was given to the Hands on House for updating facilities relating to agriculture. The main budget expenditures were the purchase of a new food booth and the professional production of a video to be used in schools and other promotional settings.
