PFB: Farmers Need to Attend These Meetings

CAMP HILL (Cumberland Co.) — Pennsylvania Farm Bureau (PFB) has announced that it wants to alert farmers to an important series of public meetings now underway on future environmental policy Pennsylvania.

In June 1997, Gov. Tom Ridge established the 21st Century Environment Commission. It is the commission's job to recommend methods and policies to improve the environmental qualities of the commonwealth and measure the results, while allowing enhanced economic and social progress.

In other words, the commission is to identify the environmental priorities for the next century and how to solve them.

"Farmers need to be involved in these discussions," said Guy Donaldson, president of PFB. "These meetings will set the stage for important decisions that could affect agriculture in the next century. I urge all concerned farmers to attend the public meeting in their area."
