Grain and soybean bids were slightly lower at close today. Some profit taking on the board was noted for all commodities and slowed export sales also weighed on bids. Wheat 1 to 6 cents lower. Corn 1 to 3 cents lower. Sorghum 2 to 9 cents lower. Soybeans 3 to 6 cents lower. Spillover weakness from corn and bean pits helped pressure wheat bids lower. This week's large export sale to Egypt, limited declines. Corn and soybean bids slid lower due to fairly active liquidation selling in reaction to this year's large harvest. Farmers should be finishing up with fall harvest as favorable weather conditions are forecast throughout the week. Export demand remains very slow this week for corn and soybean trade.

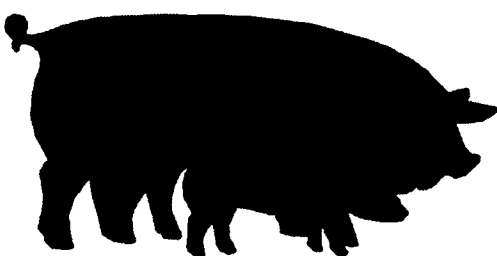
