

350 Jerseys At All American Show

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — SS Tony Jennie Of Lee Hollow, owned by Shawn Bachelor, Russell Subject and Scott Youse, Angola, Ind., was named senior and grand champion of the 1997 All American Jersey Show, held Nov. 10 in conjunction with the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Ky.

"Jennie" stood first in the cow-six years and over class of 19 entries. In addition to winning the class she also captured first place best udder award. "Jennie" has a 305 day record at 4 years 6 months of 25,197 lbs. milk, 1,257 lbs. fat and 1,020 lbs. protein and was bred by Frederick Luchsinger, Syracuse, NY.

WF Barber Shasta, EX-91% took reserve senior and reserve grand champion honors and placed first and best udder in the 5-year-old cow class. "Shasta" is a daughter of WF/L&M Duncan Barber-ET and is owned by Todd Stiles, Clearbrook, Va.

The 1997 premier performance cow was Nickys Pitino Nicolette owned by Bachelor Farms, Angola, Ind. This award recognizes cows based on their total performance. The award is weighted 50% on placing, 25% on genetic merit and 25% on production. "Nicolette" had the highest score, placing first in her class (Senior 2-year-old) and having the highest genetic merit and production score. "Nicolette" has a USDA Index of +1473M +45f +53P +188P\$ and -202CY\$.

KJF Renaissance Lacy, owned by Keightley & Core, Salvisa, Ky., was chosen as the intermediate champion. "Lacy" topped the junior 2-year-old class and was named first best udder for the class.

The reserve intermediate champion honors went to the first place junior 3-year-old, WF Galaxy Devote owned by Waverly Farm, Clearbrook, Va. "Devote" also won best udder in her class.

Junior champion honors went to Tri-Line Renaissance Diamond owned by Tri Line Farm, Winchester, Ind. "Diamond" placed first in the summer junior yearling heifer class against 22 entries. The reserve junior champion was Potwell Regal Reba 11F owned by Norman E. Nabholz, West Union, Iowa. "Reba" placed first in the junior yearling heifer class.

The Nasco International Type & Production Award (formerly M.B. Nichols award) was won by SS Tony Jenni of Lee Hollow. She received the award for her record of 4-06 303 25,197 lbs. Milk, 5.0% 1,257 lbs. Fat, 4.0% 1,020

lbs. Protein. This award is based on the highest 305-day record for animals standing in the top 20 percent of their class.

"Jennie" is a daughter of Silver Springs Tony, and is owned by Shawn Bachelor, Russell Subject and Scott Youse, Angola, Ind.

The premier breeder and premier exhibitor banners were won by Waverly Farm, Clearbrook, Va. Mason Boomer Sooner Berretta was named the premier performance sire. "Beretta," bred by David Mason, Buhl, Idaho, is now owned by Select Sires, Plain City, Ohio.

Indiana captured first place in the state herd contest, topping the field of nine entries. Larry Schirm, Columbus, Ohio, judged the 367-animal show. Terry Rawn, Charles Town, W. Va., was the consultant during the show.

Virginia Cow Wins National Jersey Jug Futurity

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio—On Nov. 9, 28 entries paraded through the ring competing for first place in the National Jersey Jug Futurity Show held in Louisville, Ky.

WF Justin Bess-ET, Very Good-88%, was named the National Jersey Jug Futurity champion. She is owned by Waverly Farm, Clearbrook, Va. Waverly Farm received \$1,770 plus numerous trophies and banners.

"Bess" was bred by Waverly Farm, Clearbrook, Va. The winner is sired by W.F. Generator Justin. Her dam is JRS Volunteer Britani, EX-95%.

The second place cow was PH Jewel, Very Good-88%. She is owned by Sandi Dale Farms, Dover, Ok., and was bred by Myers Jersey Farm, Troy, Ohio.

Third place was awarded to JVB Red Hot Rosel, bred and owned by Denise VanBuskirk,

His animal, Reich-Dale Brigadier Sandra Dec, EX-93%, placed first in the 5 years and older class and went on to capture the senior and grand champion banners.

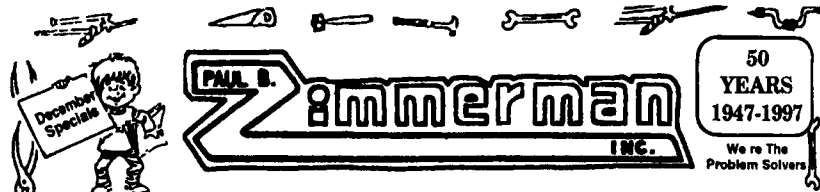
"Sandra Dec" is a Bush River Brigadier-ET daughter and her dam is Pleasant Valley Slam Sandee.

Core received the Fred Luchsinger Memorial Trophy for junior showmanship, and Bachelor was awarded the Mr. and Mrs. Max Gordon Trophy for senior showmanship.

Brian Sayles, Paris, Ontario, judged the 220-animal show. Alan Chittenden, Schodack Landing, N.Y. was the consultant during the show.
