BEIGNETS


1 package dry yeast 1/2 cup warm water 1/2 cup evaporated milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 tablespoon oil 1/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon salt (optional) 3 cups flour oil for deep frying powdered sugar

issolve yeast in the warm water. Add next five ingredients plus optional salt, if desired, then

beat in the flour. Dough will be sticky. On a floured board, roll out the dough to about 1/8 inch. Cut into 2-inch squares. Heat oil to 370° F. Drop beignets in oil a few at a time. Assuthey puff, turn them to brown other side Remove, drain, and dust



with powdered sugar.

Makes 2 to 3 dozen.
