### **CONSTANCY AT CHRISTMAS**

In the language and sentiment of flowers, boxwood (Buxus sempervirens) denotes constancy. Though its root system is shallow, it is one of the evergreens that shows good longevity, as long as you don't plant it in a climate prone to extremes, such as the Deep South or more northern zones. Cuttings of the boxwood plant are traditional for wreaths, tabletop topiary, and other indoor greenery such as ropes and swags - another good reason to cultivate plenty of it in your outdoor landscape. Box is slow-growing but likes to be pruned and has an agreeably


