Janine Winebark, daughter of Kenneth and Janet Winebark of Myerstown, showed this year's reserve grand champion market swine, a purebred Hampshire.

Janine received special mention by Bachman because it was she who donated the total amount from the sale of her 1993 grand champswine ion \$10,000 -to heip start the scholarship fund.

She received \$2,200 from Hoss's Steak and Sea House for the animal.


