Crossbred Wins Junior Swine, Purebred Becomes Reserve

- It's not often that a purebred hog rises to the top in a junior market championship show.

But Tuesday's junior market swine show activities at the Farm Show proved differently, when the judge selected a 261-pound purebred Hampshire hog, exhibited by Janine Winebark of Myerstown, as reserve supreme champion. Supreme champion went to the 248-pound crossbred champion shown by Keri Connelly, State College. At the show, Dr. Lauren Christian brought back his expertise as professor of animal science at Iowa State University to judge the junior market swine contest.

When he chose the crossbred champion shown by Keri Connelly, Christian noted that the hog "correct in design" stood out from the rest. When he selected Connelly's 248-pound light heavyweight class winner, a Hampshire/Duroc crossbred hog obtained by Roger Bentley of Washington Courthouse, Ohio, as supreme, Christian spoke about the movement of the industry to "muscle quality."

That same emphasis on muscle quality will provide meat from hogs with "marbling, color," he said, and a product that will "not taste like shoe leather — it will be flavorful.

"There are more important things in the pig business that how lean a pig is," Christian said. Keri, 13, is the daughter of Ron

and Denise Connelly, State College. Keri is in the 8th grade at Mt. Nittany Middle School. This is her first championship at the Farm Show, clinched with "Bentley," named after the man from whom she obtained the hog.

Keri said the hog is walked a half mile every day. It was "hard work and exercise" that garnered her a championship, he noted. She won reserve at the Centre County Grange Fair. Keri helps out on her family's 1,000-acre dairy farm and raises market swine for showing.

The reserve supreme was a Hampshire shown by Janine Winebark, 13, daughter of Ken and Janet Winebark, Myerstown. Janine showed "Jessie," selected from her family's herd, which numbers a few sows. Janine is in the 8th grade and is homeschooled.

Reserve crossbred hog went to Katie Kochera, Berks County, for her 244-pound medium weight champion, a hog which Christian said puts "really good things together in one package."




