NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:

Prices were unchanged to higher for mediums in the Midwest and on the East Coast, and other prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to firm. Demand covered the full range and was best where featured. Supplies were tight to instances fully adequate, mostly adequate,

and graded eggs were in the tightest position. Brown egg availability in New England continued to be disrupted from the winter storm, and some producers had almost replenished graded supplies to buyers while others still lacked electricity for grading, feed milling and other production activities. Breaking stock supplies were generally adequate for the irregular but mostly fair demand, and prices were unchanged to higher. Light type fowl offerings were generally adequate for the fair demand, and the trade sentiment continued mostly steady.

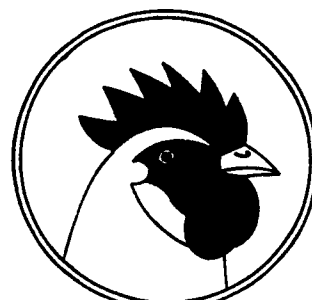
