 Wheat bids turned lower after yester-

day's moderate gains, on ideas we could have another outstanding crop year. Corn bids moved higher again as users see tighter stocks/use ratios. However, continued lack of export sales and light profit taking on the board, limited gains. Soybean bids were sharply lower on increased farmer selling, good growing conditions reported in most of Brazil, and continued lack of export demand. Additional weakness in soybean bids stemmed from decreased demand in soybean meal and oil. Wheat 1 to 5 cents lower. Corn 1 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 6 to 8 cents higher. Soybeans 6 to 8 cents lower.
