American Hero Keynotes Commodity Classic

ST. LOUIS, Mo. - U.S. Air Force Captain Scott O'Grady will keynote the 1998 Commodity Classic with an inspirational take of courage, faith, and patriotism.

The combined convention and trade show of the National Corn Growers Association (NCGA) and Sovbean American Association (ASA) will be held Feb. 22-24 in Long Beach Calif.

O'Grady will speak at Monday's General Session, sponsored by DowElanco, about his incredible true-life struggle to evade captivity and survive in the hostile territory of war-torn Bosnia. In June of 1995, Captain O'Grady was helping enforce the NATO no-fly zone in the skies over Bosnia when a Soviet-made missile slammed into his F-16.

Captain O'Grady's presentation will focus on the story of how he managed to live through the missile impact, the techniques he used to survive in a barren and hostile landscape for six days, and the real story behind the daring rescue mission carried out by the U.S. Marines.

7. Acceptance and palatability of corn was high even after tassel. The current recommendation is to graze corn just before tassel for maximum nutritional value.


We collected the following data and are still in the process of compiling results: plant population stand, emerged tassels per treatment, fresh weight, dry matter weight, amounts rejected, nutritional analysis that includes protein, ADF, NDF, and minerals.

Our future plans include sharing results of this study with producers and setting

goals for next year. Of particular interest is how the nutritional data compared among the two corn types. We would like to evaluate grazing corn with another warm season annual which is high in protein. We also would like to stockpile some of the corn.
