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### Planter Clinic Feb. 3

LEESPORT (Berks Co.) — The growing environment during the 1997 season was dry and cool, which delayed crop growth and development.

According to Mena Hautau, Penn State extension agent, Berks County, one of the lessons learned in 1997 was proper corn seed placement.

A planter maintenance clinic is planned for Feb. 3, from 10 a.m. to noon at the Corner View Farm, owned by Dalton Biehl, Kutztown to address these concerns. A John Deere 7000 corn planter will be evaluated and high wear items will be inspected. Lynn Hoffman, Department of Agronomy, Penn State, will be conducting the clinic. Lynn is well known and respected by producers as a hands-on teacher and experienced farmer.
