production increase over traditional grinding.

An increase in rolling herd average from 18,000 pounds to 24,000 pounds makes a considerable increase in profitability even if you pay more per ton of feed. Dairymen were urged to know their cost of production and to make decisions beyond the traditional way of thinking. Maybe it's not profitable to do everything on your farm, but by using a neighbor to grow heifers or do some other part of your operation, you may make a good economic move.

There was also special emphasis for using new monitering tools and methods to be able to take action early if there is a health problem in the herd. Also new feed additives provide tools to enable you to better control problems at calving or with the newborn calf.

Keeping on top of these new tools and methods go a long way to help the farmer to have a profitable operation, and Pennfield considers it their job to keep their customers informed of these good practices, as well as to provide products and services that will enhance the farmer's profitability.

Other speakers on the Pennfield Dairy Days programs are Dr. Norman St. Pierre, PAS, and Dr. Mike Lormore, DVM. The meetings cover the service area from New York state, through Pennsylvania, including western and central Pennsylvania, and Maryland.
