JANUARY 23, 1998, FEDERAL-STATE

Prices were generally higher. The market tone was fully steady to firm. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate. Supplies were adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection for the week ending January 17, 1998 in the Eastern region were 4% more than the previous week, and 7% more than the same week last year. Raw material supplies were mixed from barely adequate to adequate, and prices were generally higher.

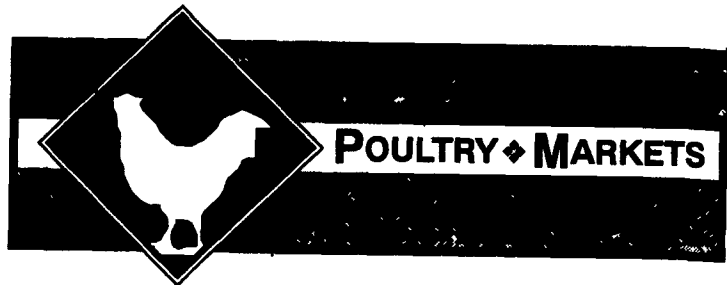
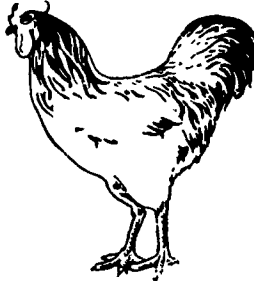
