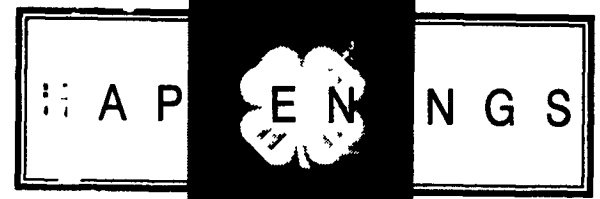

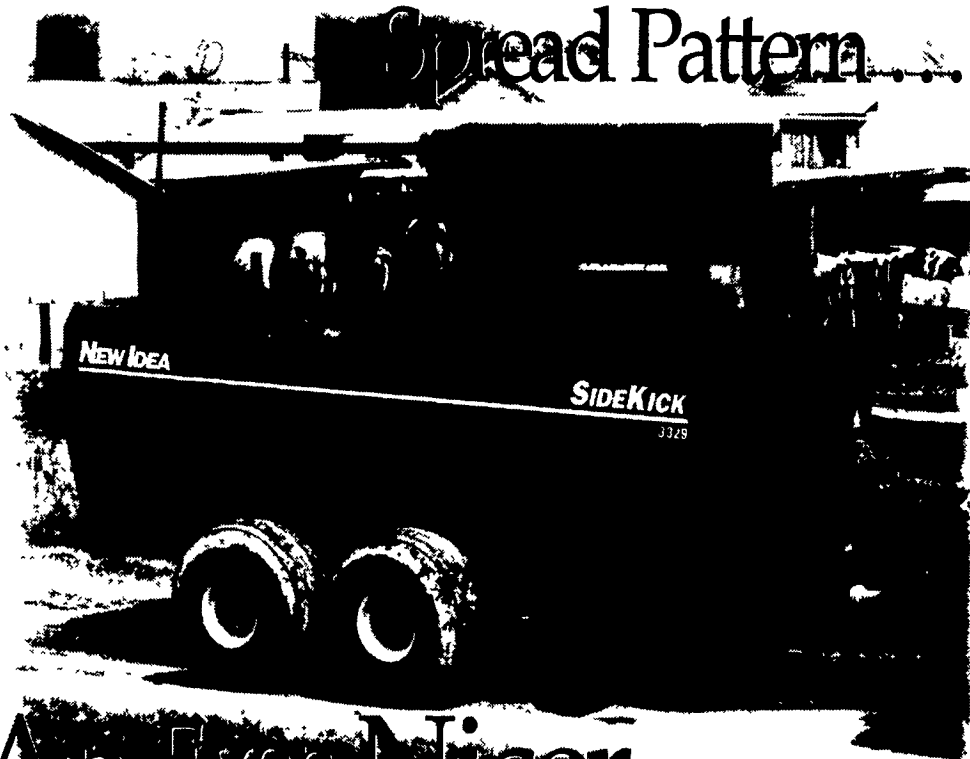
Lancaster Therapeutic Riding Program
