Excellent Cow Award

The Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association is pleased to recognize Junior members who have bred a cow that scores excellent.

The criteria for receiving a Breeder of Excellent Cow Award is as follows:

1. Animal must be bred by the Junior member.
2. Animal must be scored excellent.

3. Animal must be alive the year the application is made.

4. The animal will only qualify once for the Award.
