## Beef Expo Slated For Penn State's Ag Arena

The trade show opens at 8 a.m. Friday, March 27, and the 25th annual all-breed, performance-tested bull sale begins at 11 a.m. More than 70 bulls from such breeds as Angus. Polled Hereford, Simmental, Charolais and Limousin will be offered.

The bull sale will be immediately followed by the Pennsylvania Simmental Sale.

On Saturday, March 28, a youth competition called the Junior Skill-a-thon will begin at 8:30 a.m. The commercial heifer sale is scheduled for 10 a.m. followed by the special purebred breeding cattle sale. The commercial and special breeds sales will be followed by the Pennsylvania Angus sale at 1 p.m.

Saturday evening, the Junior Quiz Bowl begins at 6 p.m., followed by a junior pizza party, featuring music by DJ Phil Dempsey.

On Sunday, March 29, the Junior Heifer Show starts at 9 a.m., followed by the Junior Steer Show, scheduled for 10:30 a.m.

The Expo is free and open to the public.
