U.S. Department of Agriculture. (Differentials are the premiums paid for milk uses above a standard base price set according to formulae that take into account dairy commodity prices and production commodity costs. The Class I differential is set to pay farmers more for the milk they sell that gets used as drinking milk.)

After the Midwestern federal judge Doty ruled that the secretary of agriculture exceeded authority by unsatisfactorily justifying the setting of the Class I differentials, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Dan Glickman requested and was granted a stay of Judge Doty's

The stay was granted to allow the Class I differentials to be paid for milk used for drinking purposes, until the appeals court can rule on Judge Doty's decision.

If Doty's decision is allowed to

become effective, it would mean a total disruption of the farm price for milk, and threaten most producer incomes in most states, except Pennsylvania, which has the Pennsylvania Milk Marketing Board to fall back upon to set an appropriate Class I price.

The ruling by Doty was the result of a civil case brought by some dairymen in the upper Midwest, where Class I prices are paid on about 15 percent of their milk.

The ruling on the USDA's appeal of Judge Doty's decision is expected soon, since the deadline for oral arguments in the case was Feb. 15.

In the meantime, the PMMB had scheduled hearings for Thursday and Friday in the state Department of Agriculture Building.
