so you will need to adjust your figures up or down according to your location and the quality of your crop.

mented the twelve breeders who received them. Twenty-one 100,000 pound production certificates were also awarded at this time to fifteen breeders.



Altogether, the convention was a striking success and much favorable comment was heard on the


idea of the earlier date plus the new location each year for the session. Next year the Northeast section will be the hosts to the convention and plans are already under way.
