COCK-A-LEEKIE SOUP

- 6 leeks
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 6 cups chicken broth
- 1/4 cup basmati rice 6 pitted prunes (optional)
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

∩lice leeks, using just a bit of the green part, and sauté in butter until translucent. Add broth and rice, and simmer at least 30 minutes, or until the rice is cooked tender. If using the prunes, chop them into small bits and add at the end of the cooking time. Season with nutmeg.


