York Co. Correspondent GREENSBURG (Westmoreland Co.) - Two former state Holstein Association presidents have been inducted into the Hall of Fame, a highlight of the PHA annual convention held last week at Greensburg.


In the first-ever induction into the prestigious group of an outgoing president, Jay Houser of

Spring Mills was named one of the two 1998 honorees. An earlier predecessor to state presidency, Glen Zimmerman, Mifflinburg, who headed the PHA in 1966, shared the induction honors at the convention whose theme focused on the group's history.

Zimmerman, was raised by his parents Thurston and Ethel in Milton, after the family moved to the small town when he was just a young child. But he loved his grandfather's dairy farm, spending weekends there and daily riding his bike 25 miles roundtrip after school to help.

In 1952, he married Ruth Wehr; the couple purchased a farm they dubbed Zi-We, for the initials of their last names. Glen's interest in the registered Holstein business was spurred by his father-in-law. John Wehr, who Glen greatly admired and respected. Wehr had served the Pennsylvania Holstein Association as both its treasurer and president. After his death in 1962, the Zimmermans purchased
