Wheat led the parade in price advances today. Life threatening weather conditions over the majority of the winter wheat country and a shocker in Chicago near the Board of Trade put prices in orbit. With reduced acres seeded last year, any kind of damage could substantially set back new crop production figures. Currently there is a larger than normal amount of wheat in US and World supply channels. However, up-turns at the Board today reflected more upturns in the earlier months.

The winter rally in grain and soybean bids gaining more momentum each day. Wheat kind of catching up with recent sharper gains in corn and soybeans.
