Oklahoma National Stockyards - Weekly Cattle Summary

Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers steady with moderate demand. Stocker cattle and calves steady to 2.00 higher. Demand excellent for grazing classes. Quality of supply average. Feeders in medium to moderate flesh. Weigh-ups average to mostly gaunt. Heavy rains fell Saturday night thru Monday noon which reduced receipts and affected fills. As of Tuesday morning 3-6 inches of precip accumulated with extensive flooding of country roads. Another storm expected Thursday. Slaughter cows and bulls firm to 1.50 higher. Packer demand good for light receipts. Total of 180 cows and bulls sold with 70 percent to packers. ***** Receipts this week 8,900; last week 9,912; last year 9,142. Supply consisted of 80 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 18 percent calves under 600 lbs; 2 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis. *****

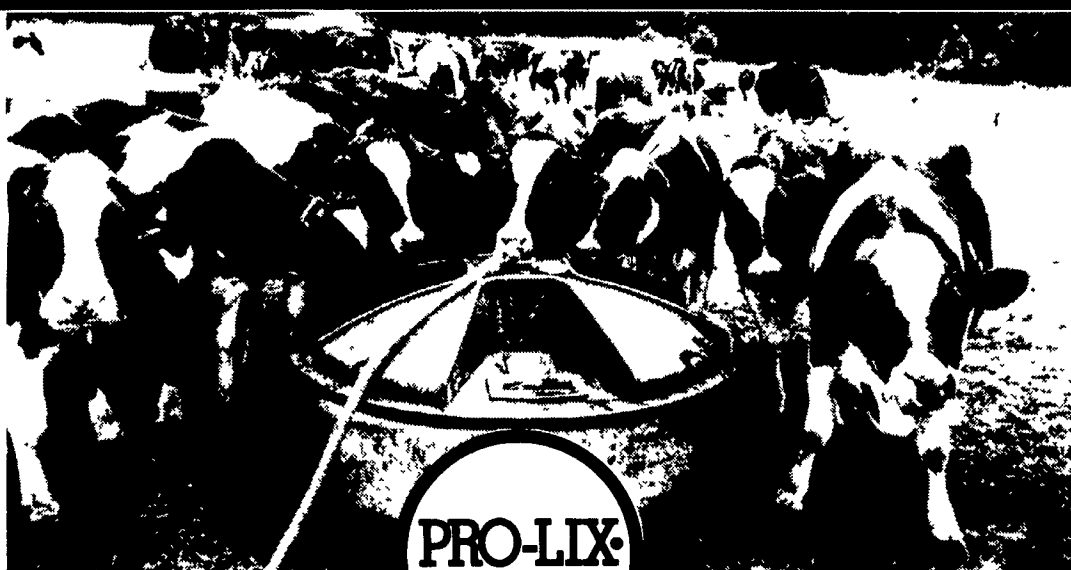
