

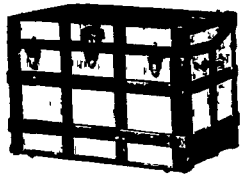

## WHO, HOUDINI?

Harry Houdini, otherwise known to his mother as Ehrich Weiss, was born on March 24, 1874. Psychoanalysts have speculated that Houdini's obsession with his mother may have been a motivating factor in his becoming the world's foremost escape artist. The theory is that the dark, enclosed spaces — including the embalmed carcass of a "sea monster" found near Boston, which Houdini entered in handcuffs and then escaped, despite chains — were symbolic reenactments of the birthing process. Houdini took his stage name from the French magician Robert Houdin. Houdini died on Halloween, October 31, 1926, which became National Magic Day in the United States in his honor.

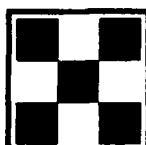

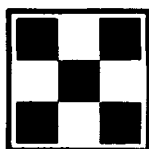
