Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to 1.00 higher. Feeder heifers steady. Demand very good for feeders. Demand excellent for grazing classes. Stocker steers and steers calves firm to 4.00 higher. Stocker heifers and heifer calves 4.00-5.00 higher. The frenzy for grazing cattle is a normal seasonal occurance as the smell of grass creates its usual great demand; this coupled with the probable better cattle markets well down the road has created unusally wide price differentials between stockers and feeder cattle. Quality of the supply average to attractive with gaunt to average weigh ups. Feeder cattle in medium to slightly fleshy condition. Numerous stockers and calves available and these in medium thru very thin condition. Slaughter cows and bulls 1.00 lower. Demand moderate from packers as open spring weather has increased availability of cull cows. Bred cows are average sale barn quality and not comparable to qu ality of special sales in past several weeks. Total of 356 cows and bulls sold with 50 percent going to packers. Receipts this week 10,500; last week \$921; last year 10,106. Supply consisted of 71 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 26 percent calves under 600 lbs; 3 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.




