



## TIMESAIVING MEASURES

## ROASTED-GARLIC POTATOES

8 cloves garlic  
2 teaspoons olive oil  
4 cups water  
3 cups potatoes, peeled and diced  
2 teaspoons salt  
1/2 cup cream (any kind, your choice)  
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper  
2 tablespoons butter

at 350° F for about 30 minutes, or until softened. Meanwhile, bring the water to a boil and add the potatoes and salt. Simmer until potatoes are cooked, about 10 minutes. Drain. Mash the potatoes with the cream, mashed roasted garlic, and pepper. Stir in butter, and serve.



Peel garlic cloves, toss with olive oil, wrap in foil, and roast

ROUND BALE FEEDERS


