DelVal Names New Associate Dean

DOYLESTOWN (Bucks Co.) - Delaware Valley College has appointed Dr. Kenneth A. Clever associate dean for academic administration, according to Dr. Neil Vincent, dean of the college.

New Policies Clarify Producer Responsibilities For Pork Checkoff

DES MOINES, Iowa - Pork producers involved in farm-tofarm sales of feeder pigs and seedstock who are not yet remitting checkoff funds are asked to begin checkoff remittance between now and July 1.

The National Pork Board has approved a temporary policy that forgives any past checkoff payments or late penalties on producers not yet remitting checkoff. The board believes producers involved in farm-to-farm sales may not have been aware of their checkoff obligations, thus, are not remitting checkoff.

Direct delivery of feeder pigs from one farm to another has increased in recent years. Direct delivery enables producers to purchase feeder pigs with a known health status and genetic quality.

Today's definition of feeder pigs includes weaner pigs or segregated early weaned pigs. In these producer-to-producer transactions, the seller has the responsibility for paying checkoff on the feeder pigs. Buyers of feeder pigs should be certain the seller is taking the responsibility to remit the checkoff, otherwise there is a buyer responsibility to deduct it from the seller's payment and remit it to the Pork Board.

"The National Pork Board, a 15-member producer board. wanted to take a proactive approach to compliance with the checkoff regulations on farm-tofarm sales," said Board President Esther VerMeer of Leighton, Iowa.

"The temporary policy is a way to draw attention to the producer responsibility that we feel has been overlooked. All we want is for producers responsible for payiong checkoff to begin remitting their funds. The checkoff system was intended to include all types of producers and the board is charged with fairly and equitably applying the checkoff system, said VerMeer.

The penalty for not remitting checkoff is \$1,000 per infraction and a 1.5 percent per month late fee


"If a producer is found not remitting checkoff on farm-to-farm sales after July 1, the National Pork Board, under the Pork Act, has the authority to collect up to three years worth of unapid checkoff and penalties," according to Mike Simpson, executive vice president of the National Pork Board. "If records exist and it can be proven, uncollected checkoff going as far back as the beginning

of the legislative checkoff may also be collected."

The Pork Board has also approved a policy that clarifies the responsibility of checkoff remittance for pigs received from limited liability corporations, also known as Sub Chapter S corporations. No checkoff is due if a producer receives pigs in the same percent as his/her ownership in the corporation. For example, if a producer receives 20 percent of the feeder pig production from the limited liability corporation of which he owns 20 percent, no checkoff is required. However, if this producer receives more than 20 percent of the feeder pigs, a checkoff remittance is required on the difference of the percent he received and his 20 percent ownership share.

Checkoff is collected at the rate of \$.45 per \$100 value from all market hogs, feeder pigs and breeding stock produced in the United States, as well as imported hogs and pork products.


The featured speaker will be Ed McMahon, a nationally recognized authority on Greenways and director of The Conservation 'Fund's American Greenway Program.
