WEATHER The fourth Friday in April (April 24, this year) is now the day most commonly observed for Arbor Day in PROVERBS our country. If you've ordered trees from a mail-order nursery and they arrive with the plant roots wrapped but bare of soil, be sure to keep them moist until you can

put them in their final places. If they arrive before you're ready, consider "heeling them in," which means covering the roots and a bit of the stem with wet sawdust or composted soil If they arrive with some soil around them, you've got time

to spare. Be sure you dig the hole at least a foot wider and deeper than the root ball You'll be glad you did.
