Bulk supply feeders and stockers over 600 lbs. Feeder flesh medium to moderate, end fleshy. Weighups gaunt to average. 1-3 inch rain statewide Sunday much needed after several days of drying winds. Slaughter cows and bulls steady with moderate to good demand. Total of 355 cows and bulls with 40 percent to packers. Total includes 75 Charolais cross pairs from one ranch. Receipts this week 11,375; last week 14,928; last year 5,581. Supply consisted of 82 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 15 percent calves under 600 lbs; 3 percent cows and bulls of which half went to packers with balance as replacements.
