Prices were mixed, but mostly unchanged under a steady trade sentiment. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate and was improved in most locations. Supplies were adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 7/18, 1998 were 10% more than last week, and 2% less than the same week last year. Raw material supplies were generally adequate at steady prices.

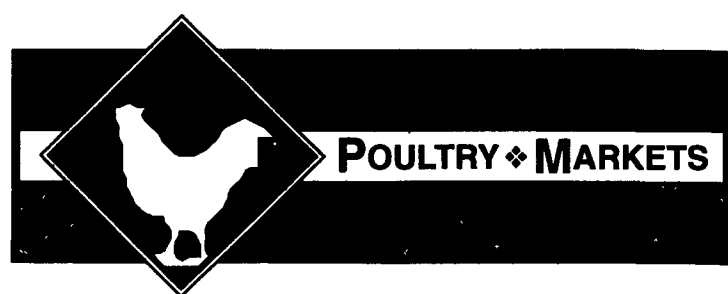

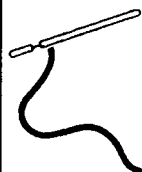

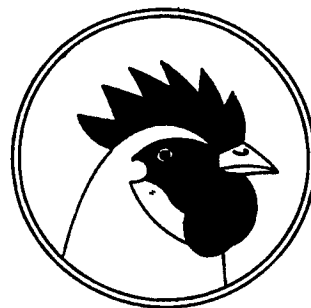
