- Corn grain, Ed Harnish, for 163.53 bushels per acre.

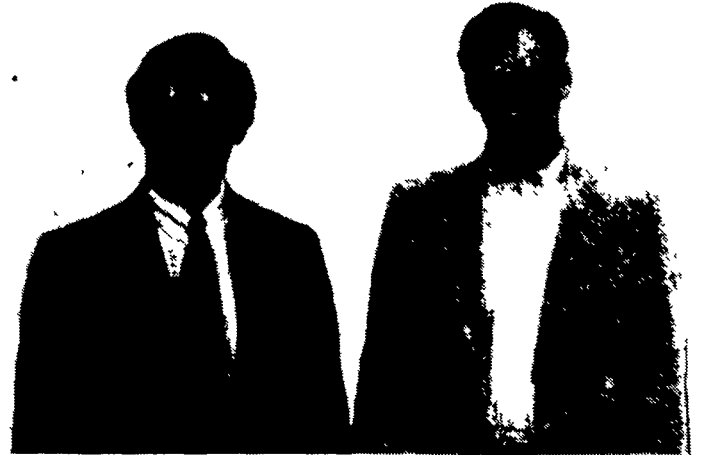
Safety awards went to Ed Harnish and family. The Most Active Member Award went to Dave Gerhart.

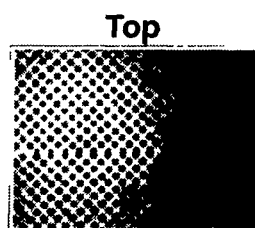
