

Arabians Farms To Hold Open House

WEST GROVE (Chester Co.)
— On Sunday, May 17, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. the SE District of the Pennsylvania Arabian Horse Association will sponsor a day of fun and learning for all horse lovers. Multiple Arabian horse farms have agreed to open their farms and barns to the public. Admission is free. Visitors will drive from farm to farm at their own pace, visiting as many of the farms as they choose, and spreading as much time as they like at each one.

The day promises to be educational, as well as fun. There will be items of interest for both the person contemplating buying their first horse and the experienced horseman.

Arabian horses, among the oldest known breed, are included in the foundation for many other of the light breeds, including the thoroughbred. They are beautiful, intelligent and have a kind, loving

nature. The intense affection and loyalty Arabian horses hold for their masters, truly sets them apart from other breeds.

On your tour you will enjoy seeing the stallions standing at stud to the outside mares. A son of national champion, "Aladdin" and a son of reserve national champion, "Imperial Imdal" will be shown. After observing these sons you will readily see why both their sires have become world renowned. Most farms will have stallions to present. For example, one cannot visit Equine Enterprises, Ltd., (Landenberg), without Paula Campanelli presenting her beautiful stallion, "Tha Saroei Moniet." Paula, who believes strongly in breeding athletic horses, has used "Saroei" for Three Day Eventing. Paula plans to focus the attention of visitors on her breeding program of classic Arabians and Anglo-Arabians (an Arabian/Thoroughbred cross)

with extreme athletic ability. Pauls owns breeding rights to a German bred Arabian stallion that is approved to be a sire of International Sport Horses.

Each farm will feature beautiful broodmares, some will have foals frolicking in the pasture. At Stoneback Arabians farm visitors will have the opportunity to experience up close the inquisitive, playful nature of new born foals. Randy plans to present this year's foal crop, which should number between 12 and 15. In addition he has 12 stallions standing at public stud, these stallions will be shown to visitors. Many of the foals will be by these sires.

Drs. John and Jane Fassinger Lee of Sham Felek Arabians, Rising Sun, Md., will provide tours of their state-of-the-art breeding center. The Arabian industry leads other breeds in using advanced breeding techniques, such as the use of frozen or cooled semen and conducting embryo transfers.

Learn how these sophisticated breeding techniques allow out best stallions to cover more mares in a season and extend the reproductive lives of our aged broodmares. Longtime breeders of black Arabians, Dr. Lee will present six stallions, two of which are black.

Glidden Arabians, West Grove, will focus on the versatility and temperament of the Arabian. There are exhibitions in English, Western and Hunter pleasure planned as well as native costume and possibly side-saddle. Visitors will be given the opportunity to experience first-hand the kind loving nature of the Arabian. The Gliddens raise each new foal much like a parent raises a child, each newborn receiving an abundance of love and attention. This early attention results in adult horses developing a very strong bond with humans — they become more than just a horse to be enjoyed — they become true companions to their masters.

Yorklyn Arabians in Hockessin, Del., are longtime breeders of straight Egyptian Arabians. The Amirs imported their three beautiful foundation mares from Egypt. Because the straight Egyptian Arabian is perhaps some of the purest Arabian blood, straight Egyptians are noted for the prepotency in breeding programs.

Visitors should come away at the day's end with an understanding of why the Arabian has been loved and admired for hundreds of years. So pack up the family, bring a friend, and come on out to a fun-filled day with Arabian Horses.
